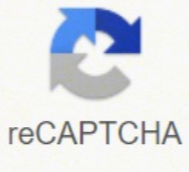

The switch can be found on the top right hand side of the canister. The brush roll is best used on when vacuuming carpets. Turn off the brush roll when vacuuming hardwood or tile. Begin by removing the hose from the storage position. Then flip down the hose connector door and insert the hose. Begin by removing the canister from the vacuum, then twist the lid until it unlocks. Once you remove the lid, pull out the filter and look at both sides to determine if the filter needs to be washed. Clean the filter by placing it under running water until all the dirt and debris are washed away. Next place out to dry for 24 hours. It's important to wash your filter every month. Your Hoover Air Steerable has a Thermal Safety Detector to protect it from overheating and will typically trigger when a clog is present in the system, automatically shutting it off in order to cool down. The most likely cause for the Detector to go off is a blockage in the hose or nozzle, or the filter needs to be cleaned. First, unplug the vacuum. Check the brush roll for built-up debris, and clear it of any hair or strings that may be stuck. Once the brushes can be spun by hand, turn the unit on, recline the handle, and see if they rotate. Use the brush on/off button to activate. If your vacuum cleaner is not picking up like it should there could be a clog in the system. Alternatively, your vacuum may need to be set to a different height more appropriate for the floor type it's on. Check your system for clogs and also see if a different height setting is better suited for your current floor type. We've currently tested over 20 Shark vacuums. Shark is a manufacturer of homeware goods like irons and mops in addition to vacuums. Unlike other brands like Samsung or BISSELL that focus on a limited range of vacuum designs, Shark offers a little bit of everything, including robot vacuums, secondary handheld configurations, as well as corded and cordless designs. Their vacuums come at a variety of price points, so you can find something available that fits your budget. Vacuum Type Stick/Handheld Bagless Yes Cordless Yes Anti-Allergy Filter (HEPA) Yes Wet Compatible No The Shark Rocket Pet Pro with MultiFlex IZ163H is the best cordless Shark vacuum we've tested. This cordless stick vacuum delivers superb performance on bare floors, easily clearing pet hair as well as small and bulky debris. It also performs amazingly well on low-pile carpet and does a very good job on high-pile carpet, though it can struggle with very fine material on this surface type. While you can't remove its primary brushroll from its floorhead, it has angled plastic fins meant to prevent hair wraps. Suction performance remains consistent as its dustbin fills up, which is good if you have multiple messes to deal with. Depending on your choice of attachments and suction power setting, it should supply roughly 10 to 40 minutes of runtime on a single charge. Its bagless design and washable allergen-trapping HEPA filter keep recurring costs to a minimum. It can also be easily reconfigured into a handheld vacuum to deal with messes in tight spots and comes with a crevice tool, an upholstery tool, and a clip-on hard-bristle brush for dislodging stuck-on dirt. Unfortunately, this vacuum doesn't have a brushroll on/off switch, so it can sometimes get stuck on rug tassels and dense carpeting. Also, unlike the handheld Shark UltraCyclone Pet Pro+, it doesn't come with a turbo brush in the box, which would make it easier to clean upholstered surfaces when using it in its handheld configuration, though the UltraCyclone has a very short battery life and lacks a HEPA filter. Overall, the IZ163H is a great option if you're looking for a cordless stick vacuum. This bagless upright is the flagship of Shark's range of upright vacuums. Like those other models, it uses the same 'Lift-Away' design, which allows you to pick up and carry its canister body separately from its upright portion. There are a few included attachments, which include a miniature turbo brush for cleaning upholstered furniture and a crevice tool for tacking debris in tight spots. It offers exceptional overall performance on bare floors, easily clearing pet hair as well as small and bulky debris. It exerts a fairly strong suction force at its floorhead and does an excellent job of sucking up debris in cracks and crevices. It has dedicated surface modes for bare floors as well as low and high-pile carpet, which helps clean the occasional area rug. It has a larger dirt compartment than many other bagless uprights, so you shouldn't need to empty it too often. It feels decently well-built for the most part, and its allergen-sealed construction and onboard HEPA filter help limit the spread of fine allergens as you clean. Unfortunately, this vacuum does have quite a few parts that need regular cleaning, though they're easy to access. In addition, while it's decently maneuverable, you might want to consider a cordless model like the Shark Vertex Lightweight Cordless if you're looking for something easier to handle in tighter areas. It also lacks mopping capability, so it does a terrible job clearing away dried-on stains on bare surfaces like tile flooring. You can't turn off its brushrolls either, so it can sometimes get stuck on loose obstructions like rug tassels. This corded upright offers two levels of suction power adjustment and a dedicated surface setting for carpets. It delivers great performance on high-pile carpet, easily sucking up pet hair as well as fine and large debris. It also does a good job on low-pile carpet, but you might need to make an extra pass to fully deal with finer material. Suction performance remains consistent as its fairly large dirt compartment fills up, so you shouldn't need to empty it very often. The vacuum's allergen-sealed construction and onboard HEPA filter help limit the spread of fine particles as you clean. Since its filters are washable and reusable, you shouldn't need to worry about recurring costs adding up over time. Like many other Shark upright vacuums, it has a 'Lift-Away' alternate configuration, which lets you pick up and carry its canister body while cleaning hard-to-reach areas with its wand. It comes with quite a few attachments, including a miniature turbo brush and a soft-bristle dusting brush. Unfortunately, this vacuum's bulky design can make it hard to maneuver in tight spaces, so you may want to consider a cordless option like the Shark Wandvac System WS620 if maneuverability is a priority, though it's worth mentioning that the Wandvac has a short battery life and very small dustbin. It's also worth noting that the Rotator ADV doesn't have an on/off switch for the twin brushrolls in its floorhead, so it can sometimes get stuck on loose obstructions like rug tassels if the head isn't set to a sufficient height. In addition, some parts of its mainly plastic construction feel a little fragile, like the clear plastic dustbin, though the vacuum feels decently well-made as a whole. This cordless stick vacuum does a fantastic job of cleaning pet hair on a wide variety of floor types, including hardwood as well as low and high-pile carpet. Its floorhead uses two brushrolls: a soft roller that can easily capture fine debris and the other covered in angled fins that help trap pet hair and bulkier material. While only the soft roller is designed for removal, the manufacturer advertises the finned brushroll to be self-cleaning and resistant to hair wraps. The vacuum has an allergen-trapping HEPA filter, which is good if you're particularly sensitive to allergens. Depending on your choice of attachments and suction power mode, it supplies roughly 10 to 60 minutes of battery life on a single charge, and the compact 'IQ Display' at the back of the vacuum provides a clear indicator of remaining runtime. This vacuum's flexible wand also allows you to clean under tables and chairs without bending over at a sharp angle. Unfortunately, this vacuum does have quite a few parts that need regular cleaning, though its bagless design and washable filters help keep recurring costs to a minimum. It's also a little heavier than some other cordless stick vacuums in Shark's lineup, like the Shark Anti-Allergen Pet Power, though the Pet Power lacks the Vertex's twin brushroll floorhead design, flexible wand, and IQ display screen. This vacuum also doesn't come with a miniature turbo brush attachment, which would make it easier to deal with pet hair on upholstered surfaces. See our review The best robotic Shark vacuum we've tested is the Shark EZ Robot Self-Empty AV911S. Unlike many other robot vacuums at this price point, it has a self-emptying feature that lets it automatically transfer debris from its internal dirt compartment into an external dirt compartment mounted to its charging dock, reducing hands-on maintenance requirements. You can use its companion app to schedule cleaning sessions in advance, though there isn't any support for virtual boundary markers to keep the vacuum from entering certain areas. Unlike the Shark IQ Robot RV1001, it doesn't come with a set of physical boundary markers either. Still, it cleans in an organized pattern and does a good job maneuvering itself around obstacles. Its battery life is also quite long, as it can run for a maximum of over two hours in its most energy-efficient mode, though battery life does drop to a little over an hour in its high-power 'Max' mode. Unfortunately, it's worth noting that this robot vacuum doesn't have a surface detection system that would allow it to automatically change its suction power mode depending on the floor type that it's cleaning. If you want to adjust its cleaning mode, you need to manually select it through its companion app for every cleaning job. Like most robot vacuums, it also has many parts that need to be cleaned or replaced regularly, so recurring costs can add up. There's no onboard HEPA filter either, meaning that it isn't the best option if you're sensitive to fine allergens. See our review Virtually no recurring costs. Most Shark vacuums have parts that you can wash or clean, so you may never have to replace them as long as you properly maintain them. Even though some models have a small dirt compartment, they're typically bagless, which further helps cut down recurring costs. Tools and brushes included. While they may not have specialized tools like a pet grooming brush or a ceiling fan tool, they come with a solid selection of tools and brushes to help get the job done. Can be configured into a handheld vacuum. Shark vacuums tend to be reconfigurable into a smaller, handheld mode so you can access more difficult-to-reach messes. Okay build quality. Shark vacuums tend to have a plasticky build and certain parts, like their dirt compartments, seem especially prone to cracking if dropped. Quite a few maintenance needs. Most Shark vacuums have several parts that need ongoing maintenance, depending on your usage. Manual cord storage. Corded Shark vacuums usually require manually winding the electrical cord for storage instead of automatically storing it away. Shark produces a variety of different vacuum types at different price points. They're smartly designed to reconfigure into a handheld design should you need a closer clean, and there are cordless options available. When comparing their stick vacuums to Dyson's offerings, Shark vacuums feel better built and sturdier. However, they also tend to have a similar but slightly worse performance on carpet. Their upright vacuums usually perform better on all surface types than BISSELL vacuums. Note that Shark doesn't currently make canister vacuums.
